

Hello everybody,

we want to invite you again to the demo in support of the demands of the inhabitants of the deportation camp Bramsche on the 2 of March 2006 in Hannover. The demo will start some time between 1 and 2 p.m. from the Kröpke, a place near the main train station. The exact information will follow soon. You can find more information about the content of the demo in the mail which we put on the list on the 13th of february.

In the meantime the preparation has made some progress. There have been three meetings in the Lager Bramsche, in which altogether 40 refugees of Bramsche coming from different countries have participated, meeting with us from NoLager Bremen and an activist from Osnabrück. They and some other inhabitants of Bramsche as well (altogether between 45 and 65 people) are eager to go to Hannover in order to bring the open letter to the public.

The action day will start with a press conference, in which inhabitants of Bramsche, an activist from Osnabrück and a member of the refugee council Niedersachsen are going to take part. Later on there will be a speakers corner in the city in order to inform the public about the situation in the deportation camp Bramsche as well as about the general situation of refugees in Germany, with a possible focus on the campaign against the deportation to Togo. This is followed by a demo through the town centre to the Ministry of the Interior of Niedersachsen where the open letter will be delivered. (This authority refused to meet a delegation from the deportation camp Bramsche). Then the demo will pass the parliament of Niedersachsen, where a delegation of refugees will hopefully meet some members of parliament in order to tell them directly about the content of the letter.

We from Bremen will bring our placard signs and drums and will be glad to see many of you in Hannover. In order to get an idea how many people are coming from different cities, it would be good if you could put on the list with how many people you are planning to join the action day in Hannover.
