

Dear people,

we'd like to invite you all to join the next nolager-meeting in Hamburg, which will take place on the

15. and 16. of july 2006 at the KÖLIBRI/GWA, Hein-Köllisch-Platz 12, 20359 Hamburg (St.Pauli).

The meeting should start at 2 o'clock on saturday and end roundabout 2 o'clock on sunday.

How to get there by train:

From hamburg central station take the S-bahn No.1 or No.3 direction Altona and exit at the station Reeperbahn. Take the exit Nobistor and follow the street Pepermölenbek, then the first street on the left Trommelstrasse will lead you to the Kölibri.

How to get there by car:

Autobahn A7, Abfahrt Bahrenfeld, turn right to the Von-Sauer-Strasse and follow straight on ca. 5 kilometers, streetname changes into Stresemannstrasse, until the Street Holstenstrasse, turn right into the Holstenstrasse, straight on until Reeperbahn, cross it. Take the next street to the left, it is Trommelstrasse, then you get to the Kölibri.

About the program:

We'd propose to divide saturday's program into two main parts.

In the first unit we would like to discuss the conflicts of the last months probably in details (hint for people who are not that involved and informed, please read the e-mail on the extra-list from 20.05.06 'collection of all statements since the last nolagermeeting', which is a kind of summary) In the evening we would like to tackle the topic of paternalism and dominant white structures and behaviour in a more general way.

This discussion should be combined with the question: what worked out quite good during the last years of our cooperation ? What went wrong?

After this difficult but hopefully fertile discussion of saturday the proposal for sunday is to work on the questions of G8, campinsky, Nolager tour south, the actionday 7.10.2006.

We, the hamburg-group will organize moderation and translation. we hope, you will agree to the proposed agenda. If we need more time for certain issues, if there are more topics, the agenda will be extended.
