



Against Shifting of the Unwanted!

Mobilization Meeting for the Action Tour on the 24./25.9.05 against the European Refugee Camp System on the 15.9.05 at 7 p.m. at the Brigittenstr. 5, Hamburg-St. Pauli

Different anti-racist groups and refugee self-organisations from the anti-Lager-network, the Committee for Fundamental Humanrights and Democracy as well as other organisations call for an action tour against the European Refugee Camp System on 24./25. September 2005.

A demonstration for the closing of the **Bramsche-Hesepe** refugee camp near Osnabrück will take place on Saturday, which starts at 12 noon at the Hesepe train station and goes on to the car park in front of the refugee camp. To be called for would be a "public inspection" of the refugee camp, and apart from that fanciful actions are planned to express our demand for closing down of all refugee camps and freedom of movement for all.

The tour goes on to Mecklenburg-Vorpommern on Sunday and there first to **Horst near Boizenburg**, a refugee camp far away from any place, that is just being changed into a combined entry and deportation camp. The ship "Bibby Altona", Hamburg's reception and deportation center for refugees, will be transferred to Horst in 2006. We want to protest on the spot against this shifting, exclusion and isolation of refugees and then together also with refugees from the camp in Horst, go further to Boizenburg and to the capital of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, Schwerin, where the action tour should end with a demo around 4 p.m.

At the meeting, we would like to inform and discuss about the **aims, places and forms of actions of the tour and what we from Hamburg can contribute**. We propose that we travel from Hamburg on 24.9. with the train (8.15 a.m. from main station) to Hesepe and back to Hamburg in the evening. Then on the 25.9. one or two busses would be available for Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

An essential content of the action tour will also be the planned an already existing **camp at the edge and outside the EU**, above all in North Africa. To make it clear about what it is and which resistance exists there, we will show a **film** which was shot together with West African Refugees in **Morocco** in the forest around Ceuta (Informe documental de Benyounes 2005, English and French with Spanish subtitles – we will provide translation).
